There is an invisible market waiting at the bottom of the world economic pyramid--- a market of five billion people who live on less than \$2 a day. They are invisible to most large companies because few executives can conceive of a market among people that poor. Business people think that the poor cannot afford their products and services, and also assume, naively, that the poor have no use for advanced and emerging technology.

In fact, selling to the poor is a uniquely powerful way to achieve breakthroughs in products and management practices. But you have to understand the rules of the game, which can be startlingly different from what you are used to.

First, the poor cannot be Wal-Martized. Consumers in rich nations use money to stockpile convenience. Selling to the poor requires just the opposite perspective. They do not have money to stockpile convenience, and they do not mind frequent trips to the village store. Yet there's money to be made in this market selling single-serve packages. In India, China, the Philippines, and other countries, single-serve packs of shampoo, detergents, pickles, tea, aspirin, cookies, matches and ketchup are common. They go for about a penny apiece and are a very profitable business not only for global corporations like Unilever and P&G but also for many local firms. Success in this market is the exact opposite of Wal-Martization.
